

An Invitation to Counsellors who have worked in IAPT, and since left, to Participate in a Research Study

"An exploration of professional development implications for Counsellors who have worked in the English Improving Access to Psychological Therapies (IAPT) programme"

I am seeking counsellors who are not currently employed in IAPT, and have worked as a counsellor in IAPT between 2008-2016. Participants must be aged 18 years or above, and be fluent in the spoken and written use of the English Language.

The study will involve a one-to-one interview to explore your experiences of working as a counsellor in IAPT, and how that may have affected (or not affected) your professional development from beneficial and adverse perspectives. This research is part of a Professional Doctorate in Counselling and Psychotherapy Studies / Psychological Trauma that I am undertaking at the University of Chester and has received formal Ethics Committee Approval.

What will happen to the results of the research study?

The completed research will be stored (bound and electronic) at the University of Chester. It is hoped that the findings will be disseminated in future publications and at conferences with a view to helping inform counsellors of the professional development implications, beneficial or otherwise, of working as a counsellor in IAPT, and may inform future policy in relation to areas such as training and development.
